Flier and His Bride Feared Lost Last Sunday in Vicinity Of Ketchikan

Coastguard vessels are searchng at present north and south Ketchikan for an airplane with Albert Almoslino of Seattle, experienced pilot, and his bride aboard. The plane, to be delivered to Alaska, left Seattle last Saturday for Juneau and put in at Alert Bay for the night. north. Skipper of a cannery tender from Alaska reported that he had seen a plane flying in a snowstorm near Lowe Inlet in Grenville Channel Sunday after-

The search for Lino and his bride had, apparently, centred to a distance of some fifty miles between Cape Fox and Ketchikan today when it became known according to radio advices received here, that a plane believed to have been Almoslino's passed Tree Point lighthouse about p.m. on Sunday. The plane was seen by the lighthouse keeper at Tree Point.

### SIGHTED BY SEVERAL

This would coincide with the MARILYN MILLER reports that the plane had been sighted about 3 p.m. that day by the cannery tender near Lowe Inlet in Grenville Channel and about an hour later by people of the west end of Prince Rupert flying low over Digby Island in very poor visibility. It is also reported to have been seen flying low near Metlakatla and Port

It was stated here this morning that the coastguard cutter popular entertainer. Cyane had left Ketchikan to search the area.

Tree Point is some thirty or forty miles north of Prince Rupert and is in Alaskan territory. Later the search turned north of Ketchikan with the coastguard cutter Alert prowling around Revilla Gigedo Channel.

Weather conditions have been extremely unfavorable for flying and it is possible the ship has been forced to take shelter from the elements although, as time elapses, anxiety as to its safety increases. Mr. and Mrs. Lino were married in Spokane two

The steamer Cardena, arriving nere this morning from various Points along the coast, including Lowe Inlet, had no information regarding the missing plane. Nor did the Princess Adelaide, arfiving yesterday afternoon from south, have any word. If the plane is safe at all, it must be some very isolated point.
