The Pulp Mill

Mr. Clarke then turned to the pulp mill. In the first place, if a pulp mill were established, the object would be profits for the investors rather than for the benefit of Prince Rupert. The whole aim would be to keep labor costs down to a minimum. If it were a pulp mill, little skilled labor would be required. If it were a paper mil, many Japanese would be employed. Furthermore, he doubted if Prince Rupert would be chosen as the site for a pulp or paper mill. A company building one would want a site where it would have complete control, in other words, a company town. Then was a pulp mill needed? In 1929 the industry had a surplus capacity of twenty percent. There was possibly one chance in hundred that Prince Rupert would get a pulp mill, Mr. Clarke thought.

Where would the market be for a casket factory or for a brewery in Prince Rupert, asked the speak- eight percent sales tax. The wised. And would the powerful brewing interests permit a new brewery being established in Prince Rupert?

Rupert stopped "kidding themselves" asserted the speaker. The differences of opinion. governments had already done! magnificently for the city. It was now time that the people did something for themselves. Prince upert was dependent upon the fishing industry and the things incidental to it. But the way things were now, half those engaged in the industry were on relief and their investment was a millstone around their necks. Five cent fish was driving people into radicalism; against being made economic! slaves. The prosperity of Prince Rupert depended upon the fishermen getting more of the consum-59c er's dollar than they were getting today. Now they were getting not! 21c more than one-quarter or onethird. They should be getting at 10c least one-half. The only hope of the fishermen lay in co-operation. 10c Mr. Clarke then went into a discussion of the co-operative movement 50 in other lands and the benefits it had brought about. In other places, 19c the fishermen had benefitted from co-operation in selling their pro-19c duct and purchasing their supplies. The co-operative movement was one in which people get together to help themselves.

Co-operation in Fisheries

A start was being made by the salmon fishermen of Prince Rupert who were now disposing of their fish direct through an agent. The co-operative had four scows! in operation this year. He would like to see the halibut fishermen move along similar lines.




