Timely Recipes

BRAN APRICOT BREAD

Apricot bran bread is a deliciously different loaf to serve at any meal but is particularly suitable for tea sandwiches or to serve with the salad at luncheon.

One cup chopped dried apricots, 1-3 cups sour milk or buttermilk, 3 tbsps. fat, 1-3 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1½ cups bran, 2 cups flour, 2 tps. baking powder, ½ tsp. soda, ½ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. nutmeg, ½ cup chopped nut meats.

Soak chopped apricots in milk about fifteen minutes. Cream fat and sugar thoroughly; add egg, beat until creamy. Add bran, apricots and milk. Let soak until most of moisture is taken up. Sift flour with baking powder, soda, salt and nutmeg; combine with nut meats; add to first mixture, stirring only until flour disappears. Bake in greased loaf pan with waxed paper in the bottom, in moderate oven (350 d. F.) about one hour and ten minutes. Yield: 1 loaf 4½ by 9½ inches.

Prince Rupert Is Best Market

Well Known Francois Lake Rancher Here With Two Carloads of Fine Stock

Bringing in two carloads of choice steers from the Francois Lake country, Kane Oknianski, pioneer rancher of Tatalrose, arrived in the city from the interior on last night's train.

Kane is remembered by many old timers as a mere boy in the early days of Grand Trunk Pacific Railway construction after which, with his brothers, Mike and Alex, he took up land south of Francois Lake. After experimenting with various breeds of range cattle, they have now developed a herd of purebred short-horns which command a high price.

The Oknianski brothers have come to the conclusion, after a number of shipping experiments, that Prince Rupert affords the best market for central interior cattle.

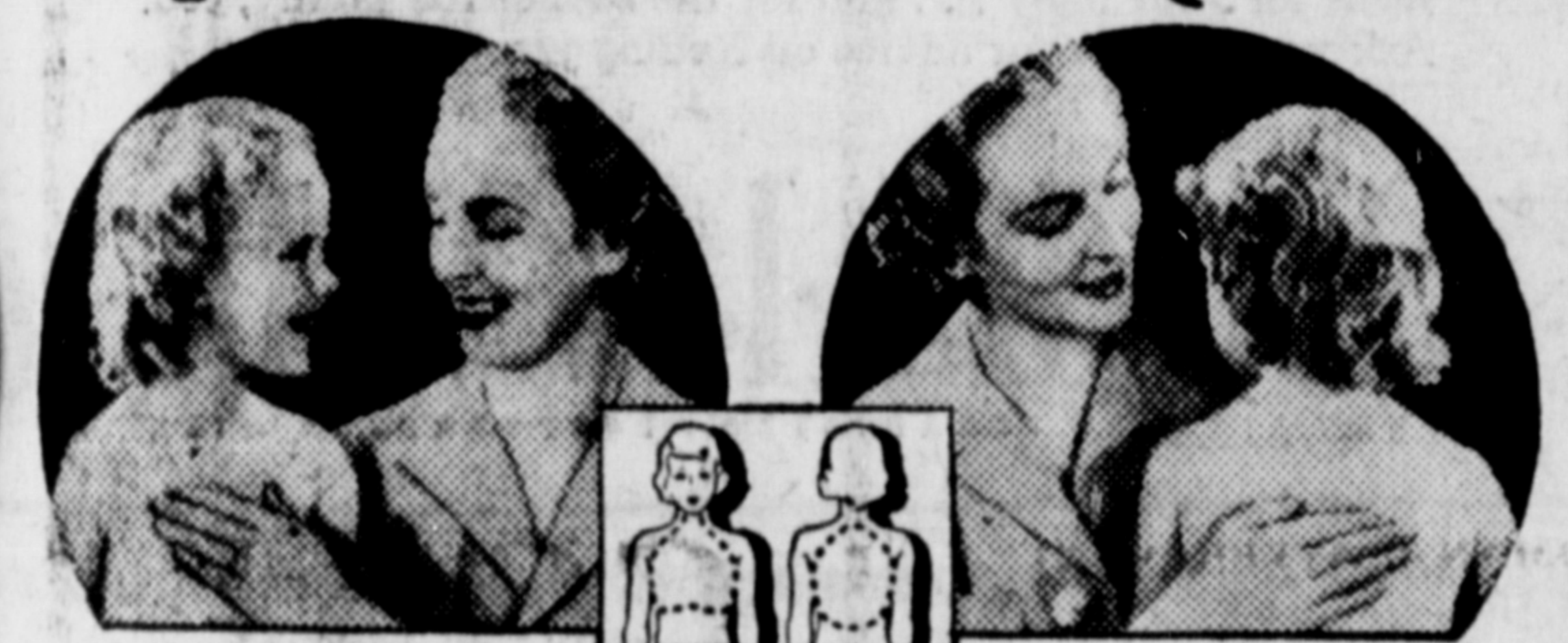
