MILLER IS NEW MAYOR

Chosen to Succeed McGeer in Vancouver Voting Yesterday—Results of Aldermanic Contest

VANCOUVER, Dec. 10:—Ald. George C. Miller, manufacturers' agent and member of the city council for eight years, was yesterday elected mayor of Vancouver for the coming two years. He received 16,028 votes at the civic election. Ald. L. D. McDonald was second with 12,043 votes; Charles E. Thompson third with 1893 votes, and Ex-Mayor Louis D. Taylor last with 3993.

Soon after the result of the mayoralty poll became known, Ald. McDonald tendered his congratulations to Ald. Miller and gave assurance that he would do everything possible from the outside to promote the interests of the city.

Eight members of the council were elected at large instead of twelve in wards as in the past. These elected aldermen were J. W. Cornett, Ald. H. D. Wilson, Fred Crone, John Bennett (these for two years), Ald. T. H. Kirk, R. P. Pettipiece, Andrew Anderson and Alfred Hurry (these for one year).

Pettipiece, Anderson and Hurry were candidates of the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation which failed in its bid for control of the council although early returns from the east end were heavily in its favor. This was overcome by the west end.

Miss A. B. Jamieson, Thomas Brooks, Frank E. Buck (C. C. F.), R. N. Needlands and W. N. Wallace (C. C. F.) were elected to the school board.

To the Parks Board C. W. Thompson, Edgar G. Baynes, Alexander Macdonald and Ronald Macaulay (C. C. F.) were elected.

A money bill to provide for further airport development was approved.

PILOT GLASS IS MISSING AGAIN

Not Reported Since Tuesday When He Left Juneau For Westward

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Dec. 10:—Pilot Don Glass, Alaskan commercial flier, is missing again. He left Juneau at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning with his twin-motored Sikorsky amphibian plane and has not been reported since. He was destined for Cordova or Anchorage. His air engineer, Gordon McKenzie, and four passengers accompanied him. Bad weather yesterday heightened fears for the safety of the plane and party. The distance from Juneau to Cordova is approximately 300 miles.

Large American Corporations Extend Businesses Down Under

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Dec. 10: (CP)—Large American corporations are planning to extend their businesses to Australia where they will employ Australian labor and use Australian materials. Premier Stevens of New South Wales said in an address here: "There is a healthier movement of capital from America, and we must attract capital from other countries," he said. "Population will follow the investment of capital here."
