Imposing Modern 12-Storey City Hall Far Cry From Tent Of Fifty Years Ago

structure is a far cry from the tiny tent where first council sessions were held after the newlyincorporated city was almost completely destroyed by fire in 1886.

The city hall was burned and its charred timbers were still smoul-The canvas "council hall" later gave way to temporary wooden quarters.

There is one comparison between the first "permanent" hall and the new one. Financial difficulties delayed occupation of both. The "permanent" hall of 1886 cost only \$1280 but civic finances were so scanty that F. W. Sentell, contractor, refused to hand over the keys until it was paid in full.

For two weeks aldermen were unable to move in-and later, when the \$1280 had been paid, they stood up at meetings because there was no money to purchase furniture. Today the old walls still stand, housing the variegated stock of a junk company.
