

Gaston Doumergue Smiled His Way To Heights of Government

Seemed on Verge Of Revolution

PARIS, June 24: (AP)-Gaston leved and cleanly healed. Doumergue, former president and premier of France, who died at the week-end, smiled his way to the neights of government in one of the world's most difficult roles, political peacemaker of France.
