YANKS IN LEAD NOW

Tigers Drop to Third Place—Pittsburgh Still Going Strong

DETROIT, May 5: (CP)—New York Yankees, by virtue of administering a 10 to 1 trouncing on the Detroit Tigers here yesterday, took exclusive possession of first place in the American League standing. The Tigers, who had been tied with the Yankees, dropped into third place below the Boston Red Sox who scored an 11 to 6 victory over the Browns at St. Louis. The Cleveland Indians, playing at home, blew up in the eleventh inning and lost a 12 to 5 verdict to the Washington Senators. The Indians, as a result, fell from their fourth place tie with the Philadelphia Athletics, who were idle at Chicago with the White Sox, to a tie with Chicago for fifth place. The Senators rose out of the cellar into seventh place, leaving the St. Louis Browns in the basement.

In the National League, the Pittsburgh Pirates had an easy 10 to 3 victory over the Brooklyn Dodgers at Ebbets Field for their seventh victory in eight starts since the season opened. The second place New York Giants kept pace with a close 7 to 6 victory over the cellar-dwelling Cincinnati Reds at the Polo Grounds. The Boston Bees, playing at home, had a handy 8 to 1 victory over St. Louis Cardinals and took over third place. The Cards are now tied for fourth place with the Phillies and Chicago Cubs. Playing at Philadelphia yesterday, the Phils lost 14 to 7 to the Cubs in a free-hitting game.
