Great Britain and France Evacuate Civilians From Bilbao



A view of the harbor and city of Bilbao, Spain, now withstanding a withering attack by insurgent forces. According to latest reports, hundreds of civilians have been killed by insurgent shells, and both Great Britain and France are helping to evacuate an estimated 200,000 persons from the war-torn city. Evacuation of the refugees is being carried out by merchant vessels which are protected by Spanish loyalist ships to the three-mile limit. British naval forces escort the merchant ships on the high seas. General Francisco Franco has advised the British government he would not promise to respect foreign ships in Spanish waters that were taking part in the evacuation.


