Cake Icing

A delightful icing for cakes can be easily made by melting onefourth of a cake of chocolate in four tablespoonfuls of sweet milk. When cool work in one cup of powdered sugar which has been sifted twice. This icing will keep moist.

One cup milk, one cup flour, one cup sugar, two teaspoons baking powder, pinch salt, whites world. of two eggs, beaten stiff. NEW FLEET FOR FRANCE

Proposed to Spend Nearly Three Hundred Million to Make Her Naval Power.

(Canadian Press Despatch) Paris, France, Nov. 10.—France the fleet and the proposed programme involves the expenditure of at least \$280,000,000, making her the second naval power of the world.
