A RAINY DAY OUTFIT

Hardly Needed of Course in Prince Rupert, but Handy to Know About.

Every girl who goes daily to business should possess a rainy day outfit—that is, a special raincoat and skirt that she wears only when the weather is hopelessly wet.

The rainy day skirt, of course, is short and quite plain, whatever the prevailing fashion may be.

With it is worn a neat white shirtwaist.

Instead of petticoats a pair of bloomers are more convenient.

The raincoat can be made at home from a good pattern, and must have as its material a cravenette waterproof cloth.

This, with care, should last for at least four years.

For the skirt, buy a remnant of serge—either black or some dark shade and band the hem with leather, which can be bought to match the shade of the fabric.

If rubbers are objected to on the score of ugliness, very nice sandals or overshoes are to be had at little cost.

The nicest gloves to wear on rainy days are thick cotton ones that look like shamoi.

With this outfit choose a plain little toque or felt, and wear over it a washable motor veil, which will help to keep the hair tidy in

To remove stubborn rust spots from steel, put oil and quicklime on and leave it on for several days. Then rub with oil and rotten tstone. A good cleanser for hardwood is to wash it with a clean flannel wet in turpentine and rub lightly afterward with boiled linseed oil.

Arrowroot is excellent for thickening sauces made of fruit juices, as it neight clouds the mixture nor destroys the flavor of the fruit.

Most modern brasswars is lacquered and needs only to be wiped off with a damp cloth. Work quickly and do not let the surface get wet.

A perforated rubber mat is almost an essential when the drain board of the sink is of porcelain. It saves many an ugly chip on the fine china.

Bric-a-brac should be carefully dusted before being washed in hot water or soapsuds, in which a little ammonia has been dissolved.

A little muriatic acid added to the rinsing water after a blue or white fire rug is scrubbed with soap and water will help to restore the color.

The small jars in which candy sometimes comes should be saved for picnic use and lunches, as they are excellent for carrying salad and sauces.

Do not wash colored fabrics in the same water with white ones. This especially holds good if one happens to have table linen with colored borders.

place. Shoes are preferable to ties in rainy weather, but if ties are worn a pair of gaiters serve to guard the ankles from wet.

Cake Icing

A delightful icing for cakes can be easily made by melting one-fourth of a cake of chocolate in four tablespoonfuls of sweet milk. When cool work in one cup of powdered sugar which has been sifted twice. This icing will keep moist.

Mock Angel Food

One cup milk, one cup flour, one cup sugar, two teaspoons baking powder, pinch salt, whites of two eggs, beaten stiff. Heat the milk to boiling point, stir other ingredients together several times (four or five) and stir into hot milk, then fold into this the whites of two eggs, already beaten. Do not flavor cakes or grease pan, but flavor icing.

Potato Puffs

Take cold potatoes, mash, season with melted butter, salt, pepper and a little onion; omit onion if not liked. Roll in little balls and then in beaten egg and then in cracker crumbs, put in wire basket and hold in boiling salt water, or just long enough to brown; put in oven a few minutes and they puff up and are delicious. Garnish with parsley.

Date Cake

One pound dates stoned and shredded, one-half pound English walnuts, three eggs, one cup flour, one teaspoon baking powder, one cup sugar, one teaspoon vanilla. Beat eggs separately, then together, add sugar, vanilla, and flour then dates and nuts. Bake forty minutes in moderate oven.

NEW FLEET FOR FRANCE
