Victoria, Nov. 11.—Divers are to be sent down tomorrow to examine the hull of the British steamer Bessie Dollar which struck a rock when leaving Everett, with 4,000,000 feet of lumber for Manila. The steamer put in here, listed heavily to starboard, after loading her bunkers with coal at Comox. It is feared the steamer is seriously damaged.
