Silver Standard to be Re-opened In Big Way, it is Announced

The Hazeltons are all agog over the prospect of mining starting up once more in the district. Work is proceeding slowly on pumping out the American Boy mine so that the engineers can examine it prior to planning a season's work on it. A pump is being installed there and results are expected soon.

Early this week A. S. McWilliams of Vancouver arrived to examine the general condition of the Silver Standard mine prior to his opening up of that property by the Elms Security Corporation Ltd. of which he is a director. He announces that his company will do considerable tunnelling and other work, the initial expenditure to amount to approximately a quarter of a million dollars. This it is thought will put the mine in shape to be a producer.

As a result of these and other activities Hazelton people are looking for a busy season with all available men working.
