When the team of 43 South African lawn bowlers arrived on the Pacific coast recently during their trans-Canada tour, they were determined to include a pilgrimage to a tree-stump at Campbell River Vancouver Island, in their itinerary. It was from a stand of timber at Campbell River that a British Columbia fir was felled last summer, trimmed to a 105-foot flagpole, and sent to Johannesburg, South Africa, for the city's 30th birthday celebrations.
