Later Pilot Elliott expects to be back here to resume his base at Prince Rupert.

C. N. R. steamer Prince Rupert, Capt. Neil McLean, arrived in port at 11:30 this morning from Vancouver via Powell River and Ocean Falls and will sail at 4 p.m. for Anxyox and Stewart whence she will return here tomorrow evening southbound. This is the last voyage of the Prince Rupert on spring schedule. With other vessels of the fleet she will go into summer service next week, extending the runs to Alaska.

Towed Across from Digby Island by the ferry boat Catharine B. yesterday afternoon, the Royal Canadian Air Force floating hangar, which is being used in connection with the servicing of the air force planes which are being operated here in the Department of National Defence topographical survey operations, arrived at the local dry dock for overhauling.

The Azurite was in with 3,800 pounds from Dundas and 3,000 pounds from Zayas. The troller Sonja H., Capt. Ole Anderson, brought in 600 pounds for which 9c and 6c was advanced.
