Only Child of Well Known Canneryman Passes Away In Vancouver

Robert Gurd, 11-year old son and only child of R. H. Gurd, accountant of Cassiar cannery, passed away suddenly in Vancouver Saturday morning. The lad had been ill for some time but recently his condition had shown considerable improvement and it was hoped that he might win complete recovery. Suddenly a turn for the worst came and he expired.

The lad was born in Vancouver and had come north every summer with his parents to Cassiar. He was a grandson of the late Rev. W. W. Gurd, pioneer Anglican missionary of this district.

Mr. Gurd, who will have the deep sympathy of many friends in the district, will leave Tuesday afternoon on the Princess Louise for Vancouver to attend the funeral which will take place Friday.

Anglican Young People Service

A.Y.P.A. In Charge at Cathedral With Robert Yerburgh Giving Address

Sunday night the Anglican Young People's Association held a service in St. Andrew's Cathedral to bring to a suitable close the devotional season. This service was in conjunction with an Empire-wide service held in St. Paul's Cathedral, London, England, to give the young people a chance to offer up their prayers for the well-being of the King and Queen during their reign.

Ernest Meadows said the State prayers. The lessons were read by Joe Landrey and H. Yamanaka of the Nippon Young People's Association. Bert Cross and Harold Ponder were sidesmen.

Robert Yerburgh gave the address. He pointed out that the Coronation was not only the time for us to plight allegiance to the earthly King but also the time to give lives in service for the great Heavenly King. He appealed particularly to the young people to present themselves to Christ for, although 1937 was a time for ultra-modern living, the standards and morals of Christ were as up-to-date as the day they were created. Religion was not for old people who needed a hobby to pass their waning years. Nor yet was it for the weak minded. It was for those who were young and strong and had to fight through the years ahead that the guiding and comforting hand of true religion was an indispensable yet easily obtained luxury.

The service was brought to a close when the Junior Choir sang an anthem suitable to the occasion.
