LADY'S HAT GAVE IDEA.

Ingenious Military Filter Fashioned From a Lady's Pierrot Hat.

A dainty woman's hat of the fashionable Pierrot shape had led to the invention of an ingenious military filter, which may save many lives on active service.

The idea was first suggested to Dr. Frederiek Alexander, the medical officer of health for Poplar—who has patented this improved apparatus—by the hat his sister-in-law wore.

Four or five cone-shaped bags like Pierrot hats are suspended upside down, one above the other, in an easily portable pyramidal frame made of four uprights of wood or metal, in Dr. Alexander's invention.

Muddy or dirty water, which is frequently the only supply available to troops on active service, can then be poured into the topmost hat with the certain knowledge that by the time it has trickled through all the straining bags it will be as clear as crystal.

"The idea of these cone-shaped bags," said Dr. Alexander, laughingly, "was given to me by my sister-in-law's Pierrot hat after I had been reading a book on military requirements."

TO CLEAN HARDWOOD FLOORS.

This Is a Method That Is Almost as Easy as Washing Them.

While turpentine and linseed oil mixed together in equal quantities make an excellent cleanser for floors, a better treatment when the floor is dirty is to remove the dirt by means of a rag wet with turpentine, afterward applying the linseed oil. This oil should be allowed to remain for a week or more before the floor is polished. Then the boards can be kept in good condition by applying a mixture of turpentine and linseed oil.
