BONDS TO LIVEN UP

Federal Issue Gives Impetus To Market Which Was Quiet In October

TORONTO, Nov. 15: (CP)—The floating of a \$100,000,000 Dominion bond issue removed uncertainty in the high-grade bond market and more activity is anticipated for November.

Bond refinancing by governments and municipalities was at a low ebb throughout October. No direct federal or provincial issues were put out but there were some Vancouver and district sewerage and drainage bonds guaranteed by the province and a number of small municipal issues, a total of \$27,043, according to a compilation of Wood Gundy and Company Limited.

Two new issues of Dominion of Canada three-months treasury bills, for refunding purposes totalling \$50,000,000, were sold during the month at a .896 percent cost for the October 14 issues and .781 percent for the October 29 sale.

In the 10 months of 1937 the aggregate government and municipal bond financing in Canada, apart from treasury bills, was \$374,808,635, compared with \$527,061,265 in the same period of last year.

Corporation bond financing in Canada this year has been substantially less than last year but larger than in any preceding year since 1930. The aggregate for the 10 months was \$125,356,100 as compared with \$214,453,724 last year. Refunding has accounted for a large share of this year's corporation financing.

LONDON, Nov. 15:—Haile Selassie, former Emperor of Ethiopia, says he is "broke." He has sold the most of his personal effects, he says, and can afford to heat only one room of his sixteen room residence. There is no explanation of what happened to the valuables he was reported to have taken with him when he fled from Ethiopia following the Italian invasion.
