Stand For Peace Declared Speaker At Rotary Club

Dean Gibson Says People Have Not Profited from the Reading Of History or from the Last War

At the Prince Rupert Rotary Club luncheon yesterday there was a program appropriate to the Remembrance Day occasion. Very Dean Gibson delivered an address and there were vocal selections by Ben Cripps with Charles Balaban accompanying on the piano. Major V. E. V. E. V. led in community singing. President Weldon McAfee was in the chair.

Following the luncheon, Mr. McAfee referred to the outstanding nature of the anniversary which they were celebrating. With it the world in arms it remained for such organizations as the Rotary Club with its international affiliations to do its utmost to prevent another world war.

Dean Gibson said the battle which celebrated the first Armistice Day was followed by a great silence. It was a symbol that led the world to expect greater things from the people. On Remembrance Day a million British dead who fell in the Great War were remembered. Forty million in all were estimated to have been killed in the war. He said it was a war to end or yet all knew what was the condition of the world today. With the developments in aviation, chemistry and in navigation the slaughter in case of war would be much greater and more rapid than it was in 1914.

Unfortunately, man was learning nothing from history. All they could do today was to trust to the ultimate supremacy of right. God blessed the earth to be a home and not a jungle. He urged cultivation of the spirit of fellowship as our contribution toward improved conditions in the world. It was the challenge from the million dead. Let one and all resolve to do everything possible to help bring in the reign of peace.

About a dozen officers and members of the local militia services were guests at the luncheon.

Pupils Observe Remembrance Day

Booth Memorial School Observes Anniversary of Armistice Day

The annual ceremony in connection with the observance of Remembrance Day took place Wednesday forenoon in the auditorium of the Booth Memorial School.

The program began with the singing of "O Canada" and then "O God Our Hero in Ages Past." Miss E. A. Mercer, principal, then gave an impressive, interesting and very appropriate address on the importance of the celebration. Names of famous generals and admirals would long be remembered but it was certain that names of the poets of the war would be even longer remembered. Rupert Brooke, Colonel John McCrae were such. Then briefly and vividly Miss Mercer told of the beloved McCrae's life and his service.

Also suitable reference was made to the observance at the heart of the Empire, the placing of memorial crosses at Westminster, the procession all day past the Cenotaph in Whitehall and the homage to the "Unknown Soldier." Such ceremonies were universally observed and the children should ever remember their origin and import.

Very impressive was the singing of "In Flanders Fields" and "Tear Softly." The singing of the National Anthem brought a notable memorial to a close.
