SIR WM. MULLOCK PLEADED FOR GIRL. Generous Hearted Judge in Dismissing Her Suit for Damages Successfully Pleaded the Claims of Justice. Peterboro, Nov. 17.—The last case on the docket at the assizes here was an action for damages by Grace Hiller against the Canadian Chile Company for compensation for injuries under the Workmen's Company Compensation Act. In dismissing the action without costs, Sir Wm. Mullock said: "The plaintiff cannot recover in this action, on account of the conditions of the law." He then called the managing director of the company before him and urged upon him as his duty that he should give the girl sufficient compensation for the injury that had maimed and disfigured her for life. The manager promised, and D. O'Connell, counsel for the company, was urged to see that the promise was carried out.

DIED IN WIFE'S ARMS. After Winning a Fortune of \$1,700,000, Prof. Montgomery of Aerial Fame Is Killed. San Jose, Nov. 17.—Prof. J. J. Montgomery, professor of physics at Santa Clara College, has been killed while conducting some secret experiments in aviation in the foothills at Evergreen. Only his wife and two assistants were present at the time. Prof. Montgomery had recently sold his aerial inventions to a company for \$1,700,000. He had only been married seven months. He died in his wife's arms, before medical aid could reach him.
