### EDITORIAL

#### A CURIOUS FAITH

The German government has its own representative as head of the church in the Fatherland. This man has the title of Reich Bischof. He tries to make the people believe that the Kingdom of God is the German Reich. The wine taken in the communion represents the divine blood of the German race and the bread the product of the divine German soil.

While the majority of the people accept the new faith outwardly it was but to be expected that many would not accept it, even outwardly. Some of those who were able to do so left a country which interfered with the most sacred things of life.

Several groups of these German dissenters left the Fatherland and took refuge in England. One settlement took over a farm in Wiltshire in the Cotswold Hills. Here they formed the Cotswold Bruderof, an organization modelled on that of the early Christians where they had everything in common. There they are able to bring up their children in the faith of their fathers without interference. They make most of their own utensils and expect soon to be able to sell their products to others. Also they are setting up their own printing press. They live simple lives, asking nothing of their neighbors but to be allowed to live in peace and quiet, obeying the laws and at the same time retaining the religion which is so dear to them.

Britain has for many years been an asylum for the oppressed. Germans or people of any other race are made welcome there as long as they are willing to conform to the laws and customs of the country.

## Hoop Team Is Coming Here

An interesting athletic group to visit Prince Rupert shortly will be a basketball team from Hill Military Academy, Portland, Oregon, which will be here on the morning of January 2 enroute south after a trip to Alaska for a series of games. It has been suggested by Jack Wahl, director of athletics for Hill Military Academy, that a game might be arranged here during the stay of the team. The suggestion is being taken up with the Prince Rupert Basketball Association although it is hardly thought that the time of the visit would be convenient.

## SPORT CHAT

Although most basketball fans believe Edmonton Grads have held the Canadian women's crown since 1922 and the North American title since 1923 the record book shows otherwise. Percy Page's proteges, who have established an amazing record of sustained superiority, did not win dominion honors on four occasions in the last 15 years and have been international champions only since 1934. The Albertans have never lost a series for the Canadian championship since defeating London Shamrocks in 1922 but four times—in 1929, 1931, 1936 and 1937—they did not attempt to win. Most followers of the game, however, have conceded that the Edmonton team was tops in Canada even in those years. The Underwood International Challenge Trophy has been retained by Grads since it was donated in 1922 but the first series for the North American championship was played in Edmonton in 1933 when the United States Amateur Athletic Union for the first time authorized its recognized champions to compete for the international title.

After winning their first dominion title in 1922, Grads held the title until 1929 when there was no final and no team awarded the championship. The Edmonton girls recaptured the laurels in 1930 but the following year defaulted to Toronto Lakesides and the title was awarded to the Ontario outfit. Later that year in an exhibition game Grads trounced a Toronto "all star" team composed almost entirely of Lakeside players. Coach Page did not enter his team in the title hunt in 1936 as a European tour was planned in conjunction with the Olympic Games. In 1937 Montreal Notre Dame de Grace, eastern champions, wanted to come to Edmonton for the Canadian finals but

Grads' management refused to guarantee expenses, contending the Quebec team was not strong enough. The previous year Grads had overwhelmed the same team 90-20 in an exhibition game on the eastern squad's own floor.

Durant, Oklahoma, Cardinals captured the international crown with three straight victories in 1933 but the American champions for the next three years—Tulsa Stenos—lost each time to Grads. Little Rock, Arkansas, Flyers won the United States title in 1937 but they failed to arrange a series with the Canadians. The amateur union in that country refused to designate any other team to represent the United States with the result there was no series for the crown. So Grads still are North American champions.

**BRITISH COLUMBIA LEADERS**

The Hon. E. G. Prior became Premier of British Columbia in November, 1902. He was selected to continue the government formerly headed by the Hon. James Dunsmuir, following the latter's resignation. A few months later, charges brought against the Premier in the House, in connection with the previous awarding of contracts to a firm of which it was alleged the Hon. Mr. Prior was financially interested. Regardless of whether the charges justified it or not, the Premier shortly resigned. He was succeeded by the Hon. Richard McBride. Between July, 1898, and June, 1903, the Province had five different Ministries.
