## WILL BUILD AN OUTLET TO SEWER

of so many residents? He desired to see the amendment to the Bylaw providing for the temporary carrying of the sewer to the sea.

Ald. Newton supported these views. It was left for Ald. Hilditch to defend the By-law which he did on the ground that until the Grand Trunk plans are complete, the City Engineer cannot provide for any permanent extension of the sewer, but provision was made for the use temporarily of vitrified pipe of smaller diameter than that of the main sewer. The sewer, he did not expect, could possibly be ready until twelve months from date of the work's commencement, by which time there was every probability that the G. T. P. would have settled their plans so that the Engineer could go ahead with the complete scheme. But meantime, faced with a cost of \$150,000 for the complete sewer and \$75,000, for the part proposed, there was a strong chance that the By-law would be turned down.

The Council were unable to agree on the best way to satisfy the petitioners without having to withdraw the whole Bylaw and draft a new one.

At last, after a host of resolutions and amendments, during which Ald. Clayton in desperation moved that the By-law be given a six months' hoist, it was finally agreed to pass a resolution assuring the citizens that a temporary sewer to tidewater could be built. The resolution, which was offered by Ald. Clayton, is to be advertised in the papers.
