DEAN GIBSON WAS SPEAKER

Addressed Local British Israel Society Last Evening

Very Rev. Dean J. B. Gibson was the speaker at the monthly meeting of the local British-Israel Association held in Toc H rooms last evening. The speaker emphasized the need for systematic study of the Bible and outlined different methods of approach. Taking prophecies from Daniel and Revelations, he showed how they paralleled each other in many respects and clearly defined the trend of the nations through the ages and the condition of the church from Apostolic days to the present time. The speaker pointed out that the lukewarmness and spiritual lethargy so evident today was one of the conditions that would exist before the second coming of our Lord. The challenge to the church was to be constant and faithful and refuse to be submerged by materialism.
