### A Plain Talk

At the public meeting last night Premier Pattullo gave a plain talk in a homely way about political affairs as they affected his government. There was no pretension of oratory and no attempt to appeal to the galleries. He talked to the Prince Rupert people about governmental problems as he would talk to a group of friends, believing, as he said, that they would be interested in knowing about their own business which he was conducting.

Many people are disappointed that Mr. Pattullo does not "get after" the opposition, "lambaste" the Reds, tell stories which are to the disadvantage of those who disagree with him. There is nothing of that about the Premier. People who go to listen to oratorical gymnastics are always disappointed. They do not get what they went for. There are no fiery jibes or cynical periods. He lets people know, indirectly, that he is the Premier of the province, premier of the Conservatives and the reddest Red, all of whom he treats with the utmost respect. He has the truly democratic mind which is that every person has a right to his opinion, no matter how radical it may be.

Doubtless some people went to the meeting to hear some of the petty leaders make good their boasts of how they were going to treat the member for the district. They heard the dismal wail of the three self-appointed spokesmen and were not impressed with their efforts. Yet, in spite of the futility of their efforts, Mr. Pattullo treated them with proper respect and gave them considerable latitude. One was allowed to make a speech, even though it was only questions that were supposed to be asked.

The cares of office seem to have mellowed Mr. Pattullo a great deal. He sees things in their true proportions and refuses to be moved by importunities of his friends or the attacks of his enemies. While he may seem to have lost some of his fighting fire he gets nearer to the people through his closer human sympathy.

While the Premier would not admit that the election would be at any particular time, he did admit that the early summer seemed like a good time for an election and it seems not unlikely that the Legislature will be dissolved before another session is held and that the next meeting will be of the newly elected members in the fall.

We do not have to forecast the result of the election. Mr. Pattullo did that for us last night. He said he expected to be returned and hinted that the development of the country would be so great in the next four years that the people would want him to remain in office for yet another term after the next.

INDIANS AND DOCTORS

Editor, Daily News: Many of your readers may wonder why the Indians are always complaining while the Department of Indian Affairs is spending so much money on the Indians. Ah! But the money is not spent on the Indians. Then how is it spent? Let us take the agencies surrounding Prince Rupert as an illustration. The Indian Agent is supplied with a twenty thousand dollar yacht. A captain and an engineer must be employed and the upkeep of the boat runs into money and a policeman is not to be forgotten on a trip to the barbaric Indian towns. Then we have famous doctors who are receiving big salaries from the Indian Department who are supposed to check tuberculosis and other serious diseases among the Indians. May I add that I am twenty six years old and I haven't seen one of those doctors yet nor have I heard of one that has benefited an Indian. The Lord said "Feed my sheep," not "Pretend to feed my sheep." It is not too late to obey the will of our Lord.
