
Grand Trunk Pacific Railway

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP Princeton has won the championship of the so-called "Big Four" in the east. Princeton's victories carry with them the one name most conspicuous in the list of individual stars so far, that of Sam White, the winner of many a baseball game for the Tigers, but who, according to the interesting report, had to be practically forced to the gridiron, for he never liked football. He is credited with sensational plays which won both from Harvard and Yale. White scored a touchdown on a sensational run on Saturday. Horn kicked a goal for Yale.

The army and Navy elevens, both unbeaten, remain to clash for supremacy at Philadelphia Saturday. Harthe top notchers, settle their ancient rivalry this week, each with the sting of two defeats.

Pennsylvania, four times beaten, has lost much support as a favorite in its annual clash with Cornell. Dartmouth has ended its season, defeated by Princeton, and Harvard, in such close contests that it may easily lay claim to a place among the leaders.

Pennsylvania State, still unbeaten, looms formidably for its last game with Pittsburg and for recognition by those who seek to define the eastern championship.

The Carlisle Indians, too, remains a strong eleven and favorites for the two more games on their schedule, Brown and John Hopkins, notwithstanding their progress was marred by defeat by Syracuse.

Washington's victory makes it champion of the northwest for the fourth successive time. It is now the B.C. Coast service - Famous Princess only undefeated team in the conference, and its only remaining game is with Pullman, which has been twice beaten. The game Thanksgiving Day might be lost but Washington would still be the champion.

cago second and Wisconsin third. If Wisconsin defeats Chicago, the present tie with Minnesota continues unsettled. Illinois, Northwestern Iowa, Indiana and Purdue stand in the order named among the conference teams.
