San Francisco Fears Japs May Sweep Alaska Industry Clean

Dirigible Hindenburg's Skeleton Will Yield Only Few Tons And Dollars

NEW YORK, June 23:-The skeleton of the great dirigible Hindenburg, which cost mililons to construct, will salvage for only four to twelve thousand dollars, A. J. Smith of the United States Aviaion Underwriters Inc. said yesterday. The amount realized will be decided by the weight of pure aluminum. Estimates of the tonnage varied from 25 to 50 tons.
