LANSING, Mich., Jan. 14: (CP) Governor Frank Murphy of Michigan announced yesterday afternoon that the General Motors Corporation and United States Automobile Workers' Union had agreed to send representatives to a peace conference here today.

Unless the strike is settled, the General Motors management announced yesterday that there would be an entire shut-down, throwing 135,000 employees of all departments out of work.
