
SIR MALCOLM CAMBELL'S "BLUEBIRD" SHATTERS MOTORBOAT SPEED RECORD

Great English Jockey Announces Retirement-To Become Trainer

MANCHESTER, Nov. 30: - Steve Donoghue, famous veteran English Jockey, Saturday announced his definite retirement as a rider. Next year he will become a trainer. Donoghue made announcement of his retirement after riding third in one of the races on the day's program of which the Manchester November Handicap was the principal event.


