OTTAWA, March 29: (CP)-Industrial employment in Canada on March 1 showed a substantial increase over the corresponding date last year but was considerably below the figures of the previous month, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

Increased employment in leather, pulp and paper, textile and iron manufacturing, communications, railway construction, maintenance and wholesale trade was more than offset by declines in mining, transportation, building and highway; construction. DRUMHELLER, Alta., March 29: (CP)—The White House Hotel, Drumheller's leading hostelry, the Red Bus Lines terminal, Valley buildings were destroyed in a \$500,000 fire which raged late Saturday night and early Sunday morning in this Alberta town. It was the third serious fire which Drumheller has had in little more than two years. Discovered at 10' p.m. Saturday in the garage near a boiler in the basement, it was 3 o'clock Sunday morning before the conflagration was brought under
