Reduction Important

The fish reduction industry promised much for Prince Rupert district, declared Mr. Winslow. This fall it was to be noted that reduction plants at Namu, Port Edward, Butedale and Tucks Inlet were being operated to capacity on Bella Bella herring. This was a new and impertant operation.

The salt herring business, the speaker stated, had been practically cleaned out owing to the collapse of the Chinese market

which had been a heavy consumer. It had also been a tough year for the exporters of dry salt salmon owing to Japan tightening up on imports from abroad. Dry salmon, which was first classed as a non-essential food in Japan, had been put back in the essential class but the advancing of credits abroad for this commodity was another obstacle which had not yet been removed. However, this had not been all to the bad because dog salmon which .02 had been salted before had been .25 canned this year. Nearly four hundred thousand cases had been put up and the market was strong, particularly in the United States. The fishermen had benefitted through higher prices being paid Finest quality dog salmon had been frozen for the Eastern Canada market and in Prince Rupert 16c had been paid for this fish whereas last year the price was 6c.
