SCOTLAND IN MACINTYRE HALL

St. Andrew's Night Dance Held Last Night Proved a Bright and Popular Function—Prince Rupert's "Scotties" Turned Out in Gay Assembly.

Another excellent St. Andrew's Night dance falls to be recorded in the annals of Prince Rupert. Last night in the MacIntyre Hall the members of the Prince Rupert St. Andrew's Society entertained themselves, their friends and their ladies to a spirited dance, in which the Scottish dances were given full prominence. The music by Gray's orchestra was reminiscent of the familiar airs of Scotland, and though the pipes were absent, the whole dance went with the swing of a Highland gathering.

Great delight was occasioned an audience of Canadian on-lookers by the dashing rendering by the "Scotties" most recently from the heather of the Highland schottische, and both Canadians and Scotch went in for the reel o' tulloch with vigor.

GRIM TOUCH IS IN EVIDENCE

Inquest Held Yesterday Evening on Body of John Kelemet, Victim of Hotel Tragedy—Verdict Suicide.

That the dead man, John Kelemet, found with his throat cut yesterday in the Queen's Hotel, came by his death "through self-inflicted injuries" was the verdict of the jury yesterday evening at the inquest held in the police court room. The jury consisted of Messrs. E. McGill, A. W. Edge, L. Crippen, W. J. Alder, L. Warner and G. R. Naden, who was chosen to be foreman.

Through an interpreter George Poppadoulos, the hotel manager, told the grim story of how he had seen the victim alive and well in the dining room shortly before the tragedy and had gone upstairs to attend to his room when through the closed door he heard a gurgling sound. Opening the door he realized the situation and sent for the doctor and police. Tom Wray gave evidence that he had known deceased for a twelve-month. Kelemet had been in Rupert before, about a year ago.
