WORKS PROGRESS

The United States Government recently issued a report on its works program which has been carried out under the Roosevelt administration. It shows that a tremendous lot of money has been expended in order to provide improvements and at the same time to give employment to the people of the country.

A peculiarity of this report is that it gives no information to an outsider as to where it was issued or to what country it refers. 
