Timely Recipes

PEACHES IN THE MENU

As the result of a bumper crop this season, peaches are abundant and are being freely used in the daily menu as fruit deserts and in salads, pies, puddings, and in several other ways. Housewives are taking advantage of the big harvest and are setting up a winter store of home-canned peaches. In all ways, the peach is pre-eminent.

Peach Marmalade

18 peaches, 2 oranges, sugar, water.

Peel and stone the peaches. Remove seeds from oranges and put through a food chopper. Mash all together, weigh and allow an equal amount of sugar. First cook the fruit until tender in a small amount of water, then add heated sugar and boil quickly until thick. Pour into hot sterilized glasses, cool, seal with paraffin wax, and store.

If you enjoy lemon pie (and who doesn't?) here is its sister and you will like it just as much and find it even less trouble to make:

Lemon Custard

Two egg yolks, 1 cup milk, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 tablespoon butter, 1 large lemon (juice of).

Mix above ingredients in order given right in the pan it is to be cooked in, fold in stiffly whipped whites and bake in pan of water in moderate oven 25 to 35 minutes or, if preferred, cook in individual custard cups.

For a family consisting of five persons double the recipe and use more lemons if you like a tart flavor. This cooks like a custard on the bottom, has a top the texture of cake and is nice

either hot or cold. And here is an inexpensive spice cake the children especially will love:

Old Fashioned Spice Cake

One-half cup lard, 1 cup sugar, 1 egg, 2 cups sifted flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg, 1/4 teaspoon cloves, 1/4 teaspoon allspice, 1 cup raisins, 1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Cream sugar and lard. Add egg and mix well. Sift dry ingredients together. Add sifted dry ingredients, alternately with the milk, to the creamed mixture. Bake in greased loaf pan at 350 degrees for thirty to forty minutes.

Lard is still the cheapest shortening on the market and you find it mentioned in my recipes. Of course, other shortening may be substituted if preferred.
