Following the failure of the League of Nations to prevent wars on two occasions, the attitude of Britain is possibly the best substitute for the League. Eden has put his finger on the danger spots and told the world what will happen in case anything should occur in those zones. This policy of open diplomacy is the best antidote to war and has already had a good effect in Europe, especially in view of the preparations of Britain, which will enable her to be ready in any emergency.

Was Losing Influence

Up to the past few months Britain was losing face in European diplomacy. Her statesmen thought to lead the world in peace gestures but this was construed as weakness and degeneracy and was not followed by other nations. Then she realized the position and is steadily regaining her lost prestige. Today she is on the way to becoming again the strongest all-round power in Europe.


