WHY "STATION GANGS" ONLY?

It is a matter of indifference to the average ratepayer how the work is done so long as it is done expeditiously and brince Rupert, B. If the Board of Works wants to have day labor on the waterworks, why not come out honestly and say so, and fight for day labor in the open?


