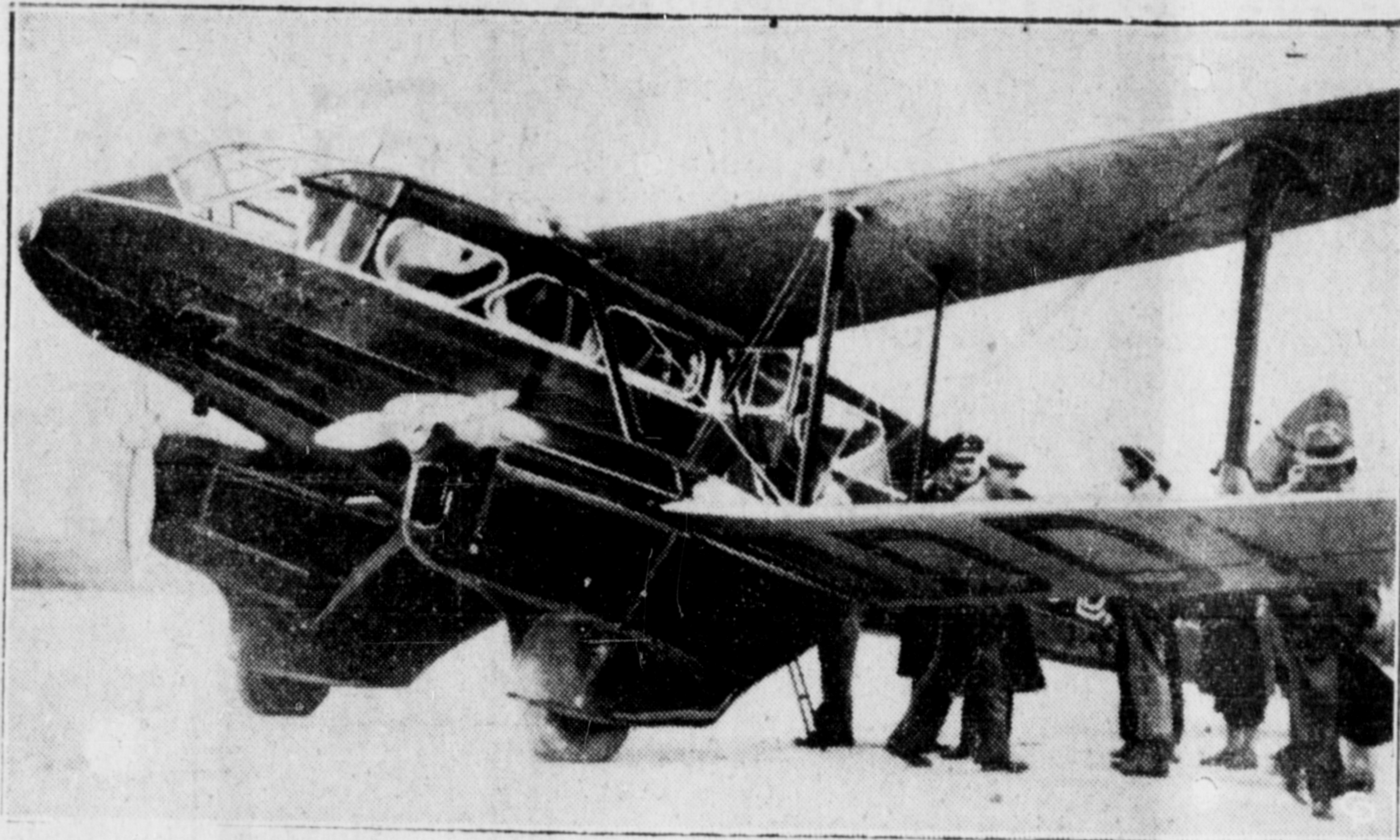

DR. MANDY IS HEARD

"The History of a Pebble" Subject of Interesting Discourse On Saturday Afternoon

About twenty-five members of the Women's Canadian Club heard an interesting illustrated lecture at the Commodore Cafe Saturday afternoon by Dr. Joseph T. Mandy, resident mining engineer, on the subject of "The History of a Pebble." Miss Lillian Halliwell, the president of the club, was in the chair.

Dr. Mandy, in opening, told how stones had been worshipped by savages. Scientific study had made men appreciate the tremendousness of the spiritual force known as God. Stones had their personalities and distinctions just as had the atom or a grain of sand if studied. The age of the stones was almost beyond reckoning. It seemed there had always been rocks or nebula. From rocks could be obtained much historical data.

Dr. Mandy described the effects of water and glacial action on the earth down through the ages. During the ice age the North American continent had been covered a depth of two miles from the north to the Ohio and Missouri River regions. Fertile valleys and lakes had been left in the depressions. Rocks indicated that the Niagara River gorge was comparatively recent. Its age was estimated at 8000 years.

Oldfield Under Ocean
The speaker showed some interesting fossils. A fossilized shell found on the top of Mount Oldfield indicated that the ocean at one time had covered even that mountain. A fossilized crab found on the Queen Charlotte Islands was another interesting exhibit.

There was evidence that Great Britain, Denmark, Sweden and Norway had been at one time 1700 feet under sea level. The Andes Mountains in the last seventy years had sunk 200 feet.

Some thirty or forty lantern slides depicted the results of glacial action, chasms and rock formations being shown.

The president extended to Dr. Mandy a vote of thanks.
