Timely Recipes

Maple Oatmeal Cookies
 In view of the fact that the harvesting of Canadian maple syrup and the making of maple sugar are about to commence for 1937, the recipe for maple oatmeal cookies should interest.
 Two and one-half cups fine oatmeal, 1 cup maple syrup, 1/2 cup water, 2 1/2 cups flour, 1 cup shortening, 1 teaspoon soda.
 Boil water and syrup together add soda, then the shortening. Cool slightly. Add to dry ingredients and allow the mixture to cool thoroughly before rolling out.
