## Loyalists Win

Tide of Battle Seems to be Largely In Favor of Government

ITALY TO WITHDRAW

ROME, April 5:-Charges of "flagrant violations" by France of the international "Hands off Spain" agreement, a government spokesman said tonight, may justify Italy's withdrawal from the 27 nation non-intervention accord.

MADRID, April 5:- There was fierce shelling of Madrid again Saturday and Sunday by rebel artillery, apparently seeking revenge for reverses on other fronts. Rebel airplanes also poured bombs into the city. The government forces replied with artillery and machine gun fire and both sides suffered.

On several outside fronts the loyalists claimed continued advances yesterday. Ten thousand insurgent soldiers, including many Italian and German reinforcements, were declared to be in wild retreat.

The insurgents claimed a further advance in the Bilbao area.

Today it was reported that the government's southern army had turned the insurgent left flank north of Cordoba, capturing the village of La Granjuela and opening the way for a direct attack on the Penarroya coal mines.

The government army is making slow but steady progress on the Guadalajara front to the northwest.

On the far southern front the insurgents are reported being pressed back while in the north Basque miners are on the offensive in Asturias and a strong army is advancing against Burgos, one-time

capital of the insurgent regime. Madrid's war-time police seized a store of bombs and arms in one of the capital's principal market places and announced that they had broken up a plot to convert a market and a nearby hotel into Fascist fortresses.
