MOSCOW, June 17: (CP)-Suicide of Alexander Cherviakoff, president of the White Russian Soviet Republic, hundreds of arrests and removal of hundreds of thousands from the Communist party all were announced by the government today as the greatest political purge in

Russian history went forward. The government said that Cherviakoff had killed himself for family reanunciation in a Communist party meeting, the arrest of forty-five of his colleages for treason and the execution of the former White Russian garrison.
