SHOULD HOME WORK BE ABOLISHED?

Every responsible medical man is agreed that brain work is more exacting than muscular work, especially in the case of young and growing children.

Every laboring man, as well as every medical man, is agreed that the practice of working overtime continuously is injurious to the worker, and should be penalised by higher rates of pay.

But in spite of the recognition of these two facts, the school children in many of our towns and cities are obliged to work overtime at nights at lessons. This is not only a piece of inhumanity to the children, but, according to the testimony of some of the more advanced cities which have abolished home work for scholars, is a piece of pedagogical foolishness.

A child's brain can do better work in the few hours of the school day than it can in the same hours plus an extra hour or two at night. The tiring effect of the night work unfits the tender brain of the child to do its best work in the daytime.

That which it is impossible to cram into a child's mind during school hours it is barbaric to make it attempt to self-cram after school hours.

Already many conscientious advanced school teachers in Canada have abolished home work for their classes with good results. Toronto has abolished it in toto, by order of the Chief Inspector of Schools, Mr. J. L. Hughes. A system of day and night training that we would not use in training a full-grown man for a pugilistic encounter for fear of over-training, is manifestly unfit for developing the brains of children.

The Prince Rupert School Board might very well distinguish itself by insisting that home work be abolished and the tuition of the scholars be confined to the daytime, to school hours and school supervision.

THEY LANDED A SICK ENGINEER

American Halibut Steamer Chicago Made Special Trip to Prince Rupert—Heavy Weather Reported on Banks.

An unfamiliar steamer at the G. T. P. wharf attracted attention yesterday afternoon. The boat was the U. S. halibut steamer Chicago, which put into port for medical assistance for her chief engineer, who had been taken ill at sea. The engineer was taken to the hospital. While the steamer was at the wharf her crew of forty-one men lined the bulwarks passing the time of day with Prince Rupert. They told of extremely heavy weather out on the banks a few days ago when the vessel lost whole strips of her rail and bulwarks and \$300 worth of fishing gear from the onslaught of the seas. One of the crew remembered Prince Rupert four years ago as a place with one big barn-like house in it and the rest bush. When he heard the prices fetched by Section 2 he wished he had stayed.

VANCOUVER MURDER

John Demetrok, a Russian, Found With Bullet Wound. (Canadian Press Despatch.) Vancouver, Dec. 6.—No trace has yet been found of the murderer of John Demetrok, who was found dead on Alexander street with a bullet wound in his forehead. Robbery is supposed to be the cause of the crime.
