WHAT IS AN AMATEUR?
What constitutes an amateur athlete? The question has

An athlete who never has received compensation or competed for a reward of any kind, except in an authorized competition; or who has never received a reward purely for an exhibition of his skill; or who has never been paid by any athletic organization for service of any kind; or who has never received compensation for joining any athletic organization or for continuing as a member.

An athlete who has never entered a competition under a name not his own, or from a club of which he was not a member in good standing.

An athlete who has never knowingly competed with professionals or entered any competition open to professionals.

An athlete who has never challenged a professional, or issued a challenge to compete with anyone for money.

An athlete who has never sold or pawned any prize won in an authorized competition.
