HIS VOICE VERY FINE

Real Musical Treat Given by Erik Frey, Blind Seattle Baritone

Prince Rupert music lovers had a rare treat last night in the recital of Erik Frey, Seattle baritone, who appeared at First United Church, sponsored and assisted by the Varden Singers.

Mr. Frey, who is totally blind, is the possessor of a rich baritone voice and he knows how to use it. His diction is well-nigh perfect, his interpretation left nothing to be desired and at all times he gave the impression that he really liked to sing. As the Chicago Tribune News says of him: "It is easy to listen to him when he sings. He laughs when he sings 'I Love Life'."

The actual program consisted of a carefully selected group ranging from the magnificent "Arm, Arm, Ye Brave" of Handel and the delicate "O Lisbona" of Donizetti down to the ever popular "Sylvia" of Olej Speaks. In response to repeated requests the singer gave several encores.

The Varden Singers, under Peter Lien, contributed four pleasing choral numbers which showed very careful preparation. Mr. Lien's conducting was a pleasure to watch and consistently gave the impression that he and his singers had really caught the "mood" of the numbers being sung. The final offering, a Norwegian folk song arranged by Grieg, sung by Mr. Frey and the Varden Singers was a fitting climax to a thoroughly enjoyable concert.

There has been little seining of herring in the harbor during the past week, the cold weather having evidently forced the fish down too deep for the nets. The organization of the Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd. is standing by, however, ready to start fishing and grinding the fish in the plant at Tucks Inlet as soon as they are available. Some difficulty is reported to have been experienced around the Tucks Inlet plant during the week owing to ice.
