

SPEAKS OF NAVIGATION

Gyro Club Receives Interesting Information From Dr. Neal M. Carter

Some of the modern methods of marine navigation were described by Dr. Neal M. Carter, director of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station, in speaking before the Prince Rupert Gyro Club at its regular weekly luncheon yesterday. With the use of diagrams, he explained methods of reckoning ships' positions and courses. Some of the earlier methods of navigation were referred to after which the more up-to-date means were discussed. Not only could ships, by use of radio and other means, know exactly where they were today and pursue their courses accurately even in coastal waters of limited extent but depths of water and proximity of land could be constantly and effectively checked. Details of some of the navigating equipment and devices were described.

Such subjects as latitude and longitude determination, direction finding, sounding and sound ranging were discussed in the course of the address which was much appreciated by the listeners in spite of somewhat technical and mathematical nature.

Gillis Royer Off To Dawson; Moose Pay Him Honor

Gillis Royer sailed this morning on the Princess Norah for Dawson where he will spend the season, expecting to return here in the fall. Last night the Moose Lodge, B. J. Bacon, dictator, and Moose Legion, A. K. Nelson, Great North Moose, at a joint meeting during which refreshments were served, presented Mr. Royer with a handsome set of binoculars.

WHIFFLETS

From the Waterfront

With a large list of passengers including returning northerners who have been wintering in the south, C. P. R. steamer Princess Norah, Capt. William Palmer, arrived in port at 8 o'clock this morning from Vancouver and sailed an hour later for Skagway and other Alaska points whence she is due back here next Monday afternoon southbound. Twelve persons took passage from here for the north on the vessel.

The local halibut boat Gony arrived in port this morning with a catch of halibut which will go on the board tomorrow. There are no other boats in today.

The Department of Transport announces that a fog gun has been installed on Green Island, Chatham Sound, and will operate from May 1 during foggy or obscure weather, giving an explosive signal every minute. The signal will be emitted from the top end of a pipe extending above the roof of a small building located 60 feet southward of the lighthouse.

Armour Salvage Co.'s power tug Algic, Capt. Reg Green, left at 4 o'clock yesterday for Walker Lake in Dean Channel where a boiler will be dismantled from the old cannery there and taken to Port Edward where B. C. Packers are putting in a reduction plant.

GOING TO CHILCOTIN

Group of Miners Being Sent South By James Killas of This City

When the steamer Catala sailed Tuesday afternoon for the south she had on board a group of miners being sent by Jim Killas of this city to carry out further development work on the Killas group of claims at Perkins Peak in the Chilcotin district. This property which is reached by way of Williams Lake is a straight gold property carrying as high as 2.2 ounces, according to government assays. The lead has been traced for five thousand feet and is from thirty to forty feet wide.

The party which is leaving here will take two tons of food and material and this will have to be

carried by truck from Williams Lake and packed on pack horses the final sixteen miles. They plan to stay on the property making open cuts and a small amount of tunnelling for five months.

Work has been done on the property during the past two seasons and last year it was examined by engineers of two of the big companies, each of which advised further development work along the lines about to be carried out.

Associated with Mr. Killas in the enterprise are James Peacock and F. M. Crosby, both of this city.

ATTEMPTED SUICIDE

A man who had evidently attempted to take his own life by slashing his wrists and throat in a cabin along the railway track two or three miles east of the city was brought in this morning by the police. Today he was adjudged insane and will be taken tonight aboard the Prince George to Esson-dale.
