

He wanted it understood, however, that Jim, while operating the chicken farm, was doing it only for i the Noggins' own good. "Jim is independent, what I mean to say," Pudbury testified. "I have no control of him. He just gives me all the eggs, that's all. It's a neighborly arrangement, as you might say."

Magistrate Hall said Pudbury deserved heavy punishment. He lectured the accused severely and said that next time he burned Mrs. Noggins' hen house he should give her a day's warning so that she could; leave her house and avoid the dan-

ger of being burned also. Meanwhile the Saanich Council met in special session to consider Pudbury's outrage.
