Waterfront Whiffs

Salmon Packing Season to Get Under Way Next Thursday With Start Of Sockeye Fishing—Halibut Prices Higher

Gillnet salmon fishing gets under way for the canneries in Prince Rupert district on July 1 at 12:01 a.m. with the commencement of the legalized use of sockeye nets. During the past few days sockeye have been seen jumping in waters off the mouth of the Skeena and Naas Rivers, indicating that a fair run may be expected. Three

less canneries are operating this season than last, Mill Bay on the Naas River, British-American (Port Essington) on the Skeena and Boswell down the coast being closed down although used as camps.

The operating canneries this season are:
Naas River — Arrandale and Wales Island.

Skeena River—Inverness, Sunnyside, North Pacific, Cassiar, Claxton, Carlisle and Haysport.
Central area—Butedale, Klemtu and Namu.

Bella Coola—Tallheo.
Rivers Inlet—Provincial, Good Hope, Beaver, Wadhams and Goose Bay.
Smith's Inlet—Margaret Bay.

Union steamer Cardena, Capt. John Boden, having been delayed by making extra calls at Rivers Inlet cannery points this trip north, arrived in port at 8:30 this morning from the south and sailed a couple of hours later on her return to Vancouver and waypoints. The Cardena brought north a large number of salmon cannery workers and also had eight round trippers on board.

Not so many of the larger American vessels landed halibut catches at Prince Rupert during the past week. Prices were somewhat higher in average than the week previous. The top bid for Canadian fish was 8c and 5.5c which the Gony received for 14,000

fishings for the summer to engage in salmon packing—Arctic for the New England Fish Co. in Alaska and the Nordic in Puget Sound.

C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, is due in port at 3:45 this afternoon from Alaska and will sail at 5:30 p.m. for Vancouver. The vessel has on board a large party of round trip tourists.

One-Third Estate Granted to Widow

REGINA, June 26: (CP)—Mrs. Jennie Cranston Williams of Chicago, will receive one-third of her late husband's estate consisting mostly of large tracts of farm land in Saskatchewan. Total value of the estate is \$748,000.

Reversing the decision of a lower court, the Saskatchewan Court of Appeal in a judgment handed down here awarded the one-third share to the widow. Mr. Williams died in Illinois in 1936, leaving most of his holdings to the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago.

In allowing the widow's appeal the senior court ordered that she be given one-third of the land plus one-third of the 1936 crop, minus \$96,000 already paid to her under original provisions of the will.
