From the Waterfront

Hydrographic Survey Ship Pays Visit—Much Fish from Ketchikan — Co-operative Landings Today.

The Dominion hydrographic survey steamer William J. Stewart was a week-end visitor to port, being tied up at the ocean dock. The vessel arrived at 10:45 Saturday morning from the West Coast of Queen Charlotte Islands and was here until Sunday night when she left for Rivers Inlet. The most of the past season the Stewart has been spending around Cape Scott and elsewhere in the vicinity of the north end of Vancouver Island. She recently came to the Queen Charlottes. For a short time she will remain at Rivers Inlet before proceeding to the Gulf of Georgia. She was here to take on coal and supplies. Capt. Moore is master of the Stewart, the work from which is in charge of H. D. Parizeau, Dominion hydrographer.

Motorship Bellingham was in port Saturday night with four carloads of salmon and halibut for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways. The vessel is due back here again this afternoon with more fish.

The Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-operative packers Azurite today delivered 1000 pounds of cohoes from Wark Canal and 11,000 pounds from Dundas. Troller Nord, Capt. Martin Fladsett, brought in 1000 pounds and troller Arcadia, Capt. Alf Lind, 2900 pounds, all of which were taken by the co-operative at the advance price of 9c and 8 1/2c.

There were 246 passengers aboard the steamer Princess Charlotte on her arrival here from Alaska Saturday. Four persons disembarked at this port while four went south aboard her.

Having on board some seven thousand cases of canned salmon for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways, Northland Transportation Co.'s steamer North Sea, Capt. A. W. Nickerson, arrived in port at 6 o'clock this morning from Ketchikan and, after discharging, sailed later in the morning in continuation of her voyage to Seattle.

Completing her final voyage of the season on the Alaska route, C. N. R. steamer Princess Robert, Capt. H. E. Nedden, arrived in port at 9 o'clock yesterday morning from Skagway and other northern points and sailed at 3 p.m. for Vancouver. The Princess Robert in a few days will make a special five day cruise from Vancouver as far north as Gardner Canal. During the coming fall, it is expected she may make at least one voyage to California. She had 336 passengers on board yesterday.

Carrying a large list of passengers, consisting largely of round trip tourists, C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, making her final voyage on summer schedule, arrived in port at 8 o'clock this morning and sailed a couple of hours later for Alaska points whence she is due back here Saturday afternoon southbound. After this voyage, the Louise will continue in the Alaska service on fall schedule. She had 194 passengers on board today. Seven disembarked here while one boarded her here for the south.
