#### Dried Out Farmers Move

In the United States it is estimated that seventy thou-A sand farmers are moving this year from the dried out, sun-scorched areas to places where there is a greater amount of moisture and consequently larger crops.

In Canada there has been a movement in a much smaller way but most of the farmers in the dry belt are reluctant to leave behind their farm buildings, their friends and neighbors and start out in a new district.

The districts that offer most attractions to the dried out farmers in Canada are the Peace River wheat areas and the fertile valleys of British Columbia.
