ITALY AGREES

ROME, Jan. 7: (CP)-Italy, agreeing "in principle" that foreign volunteers should be discouraged from enlisting in Spain, answered Franco-British demands for non-intervention with reservations pointed at the French. The reservations were based particularly on the question of the Franco-Spanish border over which most of the international volunteers fighting with Madrid have passed. The note also contended that Italy had brought up the volunteer question in August but France did not accept her point of view.
