Long accounts of Gracie Fields fe appeared in the papers when she was congratulated on being made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire. But one of the main reasons for its bestowal was not mentioned. Gracie Fields, gay, shrewd and seemingly blase, is shy. She does not like her charities to be made part of her pub-

For years she has maintained at her personal expense a home for the children and orphans of vaudeville players. There are 31 children at present in the Gracie Fields Home at Peace Haven, near Brighton. Each child is treated as if it was one of Gracie Fields' family and the home is recognized as a model of its kind. Charity is a private affair with "our Gracie" and she did not get her honor by merely singing for it.


