We feel that, instead of abandoning railway lines, the transportation over them might be modified somewhat from present methods. Light motor cars might be run instead of complete trains as at present so that the people might still get a service but not so expensive a service as at present.

While highway transportation has been making tremendous progress of late, railway transportation has continued in very much the same old way and has not adapted itself to modern conditions. This is true both in the United States and Canada.

We realize that, in saying this, we are laying ourselves open to the charge of pretending to know more about the railway business than railwaymen. Of course, there are difficulties in the way of making changes. At the same time we feel that the railways must be made to pay their own way without any increase in the cost of carrying either freight or passengers and that also it must not be necessary to cut down services except in the case of parallel lines which do not serve any new country such as the lines between Kamloops and Vancouver which! is one of the lines proposed to be abandoned.

We feel strongly that it would be much better to continue to pay the present loss rather than curtail services which would seriously injure the development of the

country. Suppose Sir Edward had proposed to close down the railway between Prince Rupert and Winnipeg because it is not paying its way, how wuld we have felt about it? No, the hands of the clock must not be put back. What is needed is to make the present system pay its way without cutting down.




