STEW WITH TOMATO JUICE

**RECIPE**  
1 to 2 cups Royal City Tomato Juice  
1 1/2 lbs. round steak 3/4 inch thick  
4 tablespoons flour  
Salt and Pepper

Season flour with salt and pepper and pound into meat. Sear steak in a skillet with a small amount of fat. When well browned, pour 1 cup Tomato Juice over it, cover and bake in moderate oven (375° F.) until meat is tender, adding more Tomato Juice, if needed, during the baking. Serve with sauce that remains in skillet.
